**Section 85.160 New World Screwworm Detection
EMERGENCY**

- a) For the purposes of this Emergency Rule, the following definitions shall apply:
- 1) "Captive wildlife" means mammals and birds maintained in captivity for exhibition (including zoos), sale, personal use, education, propagation, preservation, protection, or hunting purposes, with no expectation of returning to or allowing to move freely in the wild.
 - 2) "Certificate of Veterinary Inspection", "CVI", "ICVI", or "Health Certificate" mean a legible record, made on an official form of the state of origin or the Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service of the United States Department of Agriculture, issued by an accredited veterinarian of the state of origin or a veterinarian in the employ of the Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service of the United States Department of Agriculture, which shows that the animals listed thereon meet the health requirements of the state of Illinois.
 - 3) "Companion animal" means mammals and birds considered as pets or for companionship, such as dogs, cats and rabbits, or feral (as that word is defined in the Playbook) companion animals held in captivity.
 - 4) "Days" means calendar days; includes weekends and holidays.
 - 5) "Infested zone" means zone that immediately surrounds a premises with an infested domestic animal, the location of infested wildlife, or the location of NWS fly detection.
 - 6) "Livestock" means mammals and birds, including all production and farm-raised animals, including cattle, swine, sheep, goats, poultry, equids, farmed cervid herds, and captive wildlife.
 - 7) "New World Screwworm" or "NWS" mean *cochliomyia hominivorax*, in any developmental stage.
 - 8) "NWS certification" means a written declaration stating: "This/These animal(s) has/have been examined and is/are determined to be free of contagious and infectious disease or infestation with New World Screwworm."
 - 9) "Playbook" or "Response Playbook" means the United States Department of Agriculture Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service Response

Playbook for New World Screwworm, and its incorporated references, requirements, and guides, as publicly posted on the USDA website. Department will include a link to this Playbook on its website and post notification regarding which version of the Playbook is applicable if the Playbook is updated after the publication of these Emergency Rules.

- 10) "Pre-movement animal movement certificate" or "NWS animal movement certificate" mean certificate form for documenting the inspection of animals and administration of NWS animal drugs and/or pesticide products, when appropriate, and certifying animals to be moved are free from NWS infestation. This certificate must be completed by an accredited veterinarian, State/Federal Official or NWS certified inspector as determined by the state of origin.
 - 11) "USDA APHIS" or "USDA" mean United States Department of Agriculture Animal and Health Inspection Service.
- b) CVI requirements. The CVI or health certificate must contain:
- 1) the name and address of the consignor;
 - 2) the name and address of the consignee;
 - 3) an accurate description or identification of the animals involved;
 - 4) the health status of the animal(s), including result(s) and date(s) of required test(s), and vaccination(s), if any;
 - 5) NWS certification; and
 - 6) anything otherwise required by federal regulation.
- c) Entry requirements and restrictions.
- 1) Prior to entering Illinois from a state with an infested zone, as detailed in subsection (d) below, the following are required for all livestock and companion animals:
 - A) Entry permit number obtained;
 - B) CVI sent to Department; and
 - C) Pre-movement animal movement certificate sent to Department, as

applicable.

- 2) Each of the required items in subsection (1) must also accompany the animal while in transit.
 - 3) These Emergency Rules supersede 8 Ill. Admin. Code 25.47(4)(D), which allowed for an exemption to certificates of veterinary inspection for animals entering Illinois from states in which a declaration of disaster has been made.
- d) Due to the detection of New World Screwworm within the United States, in addition to the Entry Requirements in subsection (c), the following will be required on livestock movements into Illinois from an infested zone before the animal is brought to Illinois:
- 1) Livestock must meet the movements required in the USDA New World Screwworm Response Playbook. This includes:
 - A) If not moving direct to slaughter:
 - i) Pre-movement animal movement certificate and a CVI, both completed no more than 5 days prior to the first day of movement; and
 - ii) Documentation of the application of an approved, effective treatment for NWS for that species within the preceding 14 days.
 - B) If moving direct to slaughter, pre-movement animal movement certificate and a CVI with NWS certification, each completed no more than 3 days prior to the first day of movement.
- e) Due to the detection of New World Screwworm within the United States, in addition to the Entry Requirements in subsection (c), the following will be required of companion animals moving into Illinois from any state with an infested zone:
- 1) For companion animals originating from within an infested zone:
 - A) Pre-movement animal movement certificate and a CVI, no more than 5 days prior to the first day of movement; and
 - B) Documentation of the application of an approved, effective

treatment for NWS for that species within the preceding 14 days.

- 2) For companion animals originating outside an infested zone, a CVI with NWS certification completed no more than 5 days prior to movement.
