Illinois Pork Ambassador/Intern

Illinois Pork Producers Association • 2023 Program Guidelines

OBJECTIVE

The purpose of the IPPA ambassador internship program is to provide an opportunity for a young person to serve for one year as the official youth representative of the Illinois Pork Producers Association and to work as a part of the IPPA staff during the summer of such year. The ambassador program will be administered by the IPPA Youth Committee and the Director of Communications will serve as the internship supervisor.

QUALIFICATIONS

- Must be an Illinois resident between the ages of 18 and 23 (Must be age 18 by Jan 1, 2023)
- · Must exhibit strong communication and leadership skills
- Must have a background in animal husbandry
- · Must exhibit a genuine interest in the Illinois pork industry and be able to speak on behalf of it
- Must be a member (or become a member) of the Illinois Pork Producers Association
- Must have reliable transportation and be willing to travel to out-of-state trainings and functions
- May only serve one year

APPLICATION PROCESS

Candidates must submit the following to the IPPA office no later than **OCTOBER 28, 2022.**

Further, candidates may be asked to:

• Participate in an interview with the selection committee. The interviews will be at the IPPA office in Springfield, date TBD upon application deadline.

RESPONSIBILITIES

The IPPA Ambassador/Intern will work in the following areas:

Illinois Livestock Leadership Institute: The Ambassador/Intern will accompany and enlist in the planning of IPPA's annual youth leadership summer trip.

Illinois State Fair - The Ambassador/Intern will coordinate the Birthing Center at the Illinois State Fair This includes preparing the barn, arranging volunteers and managing the barn during the entire state fair. Intern may be asked to work with IPPA staff and members on other state fair-related project areas as assigned. The 2023 fair will take place August 10-20.

Promotion/Consumer Information - Projects as requested in foodservice, retail, healthcare, youth education, food safety, etc. These may include presentations, promotions, sampling events, attending trade shows and/or cooking demonstrations. Must be familiar with social media platforms.

Communication - The Ambassador/Intern will communicate with producers via personal contacts and group meetings. The Ambassador/Intern will also write articles about their programs and projects for IPPA publications, such as Chop Talk and social media. Good communication skills are strongly desired, and will be strengthened during the internship.

Producer Education - The Ambassador/Intern will assist in educating producers about current issues, new legislation and regulations, and IPPA programs and opportunities, as they become relevant.

Summer Ag Institutes - The Ambassador/Intern will assist the Director of Communications with coordinating activities related to the Summer Ag Institutes (SAI). Includes gathering educational materials for teachers' kits and giving presentations on the pork industry to SAI's around the state. A majority of these take place in early June, so the student's availability will be important.

WORK SCHEDULE

- The Ambassador/Intern will assume their title on January 1, 2023.
- Duties during the school year will be minimal.
- During the summer, the Ambassador/Intern is expected to work a five-day work week, under the
 direction of the IPPA staff, working 40 hours per week, in the Springfield office. Start date will be
 determined by the student's school schedule. End date will be after the conclusion of the IL State
 Fair (August 20, 2023). A follow up meeting and interview date will be determined closer to time.
- Be prepared for frequent travel.

SUPERVISION

• The Ambassador will work with all IPPA staff and leaders. The Director of Communications will ultimately be the supervisor and coordinate the Ambassador's schedule and projects.

COMPENSATION/TRAVEL ALLOWANCE

- The Illinois Pork Ambassador will receive a \$5,500 stipend that will be paid over a 3-month period and, upon successful completion of the internship, a \$2,500 scholarship paid directly to the school. The intern must plan to be enrolled in either undergraduate or graduate school for at least the fall of 2023.
- The Ambassador will be reimbursed for expenses (mileage, hotel, meals, etc.) related to approved IPPA travel. Intern must use their own vehicle.
- Housing in Springfield *is not provided*, except during specific activities when needed. However, as aforementioned, a monthly stipend (June, July and Aug) will be provided to assist with expenses.
- Ambassador is encouraged to seek credit hours for the internship through his or her school, in addition to the above scholarship awards.
